BASKETBALL

Our basketball programme is a great way to improve basketball skills and knowledge. The aim is to give children a grounding in the game and introduce them to competitive basketball via a local league. Training will give participants an opportunity to improve their basketball skills; including passing, shooting, ball-handling and footwork. Players will then apply these skills in a fun and competitive game situation. All boys who are interested in playing Basketball must book in via iClassPro to trial for Representative teams.

After the trials, the coach will determine who will play in the teams in the out of school league at St Kentigern Boys' School.

If your son is not selected they will be able to join Year 5-8 Basketball in-house sessions on Friday afternoons at King's School Sportsdome.

If boys are selected to play for the school in a representative team then league games will be played at St Kentigern Boys' School after school and an additional league fee of \$100 will be charged to your School account.

Should your son play representative basketball, they will also be required to buy a basketball singlet from the Uniform Shop to be able to play in the league.

<u>Parents are responsible for transporting their sons to the after-school league games should their son be selected to play in a representative team.</u>

All participants will need to have PE gear, sports shoes, shin pads, a mouth guard and a suitable hockey stick. For safety reasons, children will not be able to participate if they do not have a mouth guard and shin pads to wear each session.

Sticks are not provided for the session so it is essential that your child has his own in order to participate in the class.

KARATE

Our aim is to provide quality instruction with a strong emphasis on personal development, self-defence, and health and fitness. The King's karate programme will be teaching a traditional style of karate called Goju Ryu (or hard and soft style). Goju Ryu has an equal emphasis on hard and soft techniques, and is ideally suited for younger students. A traditional style, it is firstly a complete exercise programme and secondly, includes the practical benefits of self-defence.

Training

Initially students learn in a strictly non-contact environment progressing according to their own abilities. Emphasis is placed on defence rather than attack. As a student advances technically they learn increasingly intricate techniques and are gradually exposed to controlled contact applications of karate techniques.

Students will occasionally be taught self-defence. Techniques that do not involve punching or kicking, but rather simple yet effective restraining holds. Progress made by the boys so far has been outstanding with many of the students becoming yellow belts and beyond.

Parents are responsible for transporting their sons to after school Karate lessons.

Extra-Curricular Academies Terms & Conditions 2025

Payment

- Bookings for Extra-Curricular Academy classes are made via the iClassPro app.
- Payment is due for all Extra-Curricular Academy classes when the booking confirmation email is received from iClassPro (prior to your child attending any Extra-Curricular Academy sessions).
- Payment should be made via the iClassPro app which secures your son's place in the programme for the Term. There is a 3.4% surcharge on iClassPro payments. To bypass this surcharge alternative payment options are:
 - either by bank transfer email academies@kings.school.nz for details)
 - or by visiting the Swim School reception in person to pay by Credit Card or EFTPOS. (Cash and AMEX are not accepted).
- If fees remain unpaid it may result in your son being dropped from his class and the space made available for other families on the waitlist. A late fee of \$50 may also be charged to your iClassPro account.
- If you have any issues within the payment portal, please contact the King's Extra-Curricular Academies Office on 09 520 3545 or email academies@kings.school.nz and we will assist you with the process.

Rollover and Cancellations

- Rollover at the end of Term 2 and Term 3, bookings are automatically rolled over to the following term. Payment is due on receipt of the rollover booking confirmation email from iClassPro.
- Cancellations all cancellations must be made in writing to academies@kings.school.nz
- Refunds are not given for Extra-Curricular Academy programmes if bookings have been accepted and confirmed. Fees are waived if notice of cancellation is given prior to the start of Term. If you have already made payment, we will credit your account within the first two weeks of the Term.
- Any credit received from the Academies Office must be used for future Extra-Curricular Academies sessions. Refunds are not given.
- All Extra-Curricular Academy bookings are cleared at the conclusion of Term 4 each year. New bookings are required at the beginning of each year.

Terms and Conditions

- Credits will be offered if a class is cancelled for any unforeseen reason. Swim School make-up tokens are non-transferable and cannot be used for Extra-Curricular Academy programmes.
- Transition, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 boys must be picked-up after school by an adult and taken to after school Extra-Curricular Academy classes. They must be supervised until their session begins and picked up from the session at the conclusion of the class.
- If a child is not picked up at the conclusion of the Academy session, he will be taken to TreeTops After School Care, which will be charged to your School account.
- If your child does not attend his Academy class, a refund or credit will only be given for serious illness or injury when a Medical Certificate is presented to the Extra-Curricular Academies Office.
- Once a child's booking is confirmed, it is each individual family's responsibility to ensure that their child attends his Extra-Curricular Academy session.
